Re: Tamar Lake Concept

We appreciate the information you have provided in regard to the work undertaken by Tamar Lake Inc. and the potential construction of a barrage and associated pedestrian/bike right of way at the Tamar River ('the Project') located in Long Reach, just south of the Port of Bell Bay.

We understand that part of the proposal may require access to land owned by Rio Tinto Aluminium (Bell Bay) Limited ('BBA') for construction purposes and the potential installation of the pedestrian/bike right of way.

Subject to the Project receiving all necessary approvals to proceed, BBA confirms it would be prepared to enter discussions with Tamar Lake Inc. about potential options for access to be facilitated through the BBA land and the terms on which such access may be granted when the Project is in a position to proceed.

BBA however confirms that nothing in this letter is to be construed as agreement or consent for access or works to take place on any land owned by BBA and BBA will not be bound to grant such access unless and until a formal agreement granting such rights on terms acceptable to BBA has been executed by all relevant parties.
